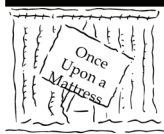

OnStage, Inc. celebrates it's 37th season featuring high school and college level students from Bergen County and the surrounding area.

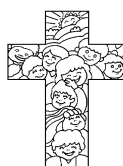

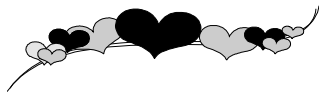
